

# **Project Overview**

The FGU was established through an intergovernmental agreement signed in 2018, with the following objectives:

- To create a set of coordinated and accredited doubledegree programs, partially or fully implemented in Georgia.
- To contribute to the internationalization of Georgian higher education by sharing expertise in the development of degree programs with French higher education institutions.
- To develop Georgia's human capital by offering highquality professional training in key sectors of the local economy (agriculture, tourism, information sciences).

# **Project Overview**

The UFG offers three programs at the undergraduate and master's levels:

- Professional Bachelor's Degree in Agri-Food Technologies and Dairy Production (GTU – University of Rennes)
- Bachelor's Degree in Computer Science (TSU University of Évry–Paris-Saclay)
- Master's Degree in Oenology and Viticulture (GTU Institut Agro Montpellier)
- Master's Degree in Tourism and Cultural Heritage [currently suspended] (TSU Lumière Lyon 2 University)



# **5 Strategic Priorities**

- DOUBLE-DEGREES: Maintaining accredited double-degree programs and expanding the FGU consortium
- STUDENT MOBILITY: Supporting student mobility and developing scholarship programs funded by the FGU foundation
- SCIENTIFIC COOPERATION: Developing scientific cooperation and fostering academic exchanges between France and Georgia
- **TECHNICAL SUPPORT**: Expert missions and partnerships (project in the veterinary field)
- INSTITUTIONAL STRENTHENING: Strengthening the institutional framework



## 1. Maintaining accredited double-degree programs

#### Since FGU's creation, **74 graduates**:

- 19 in Tourism & Cultural Heritage (Master)
- 47 in Agri-Food Technologies (Bachelor)
- 5 in Viticulture & Oenology (Master)
- 3 in Computer Sciences (Bachelor)

#### In 2024-2025, **73 students** enrolled in FGU programs:

- 9 in Agri-Food Technologies (Bachelor)
- 2 in Viticulture & Oenology (Master)
- 62 in Computer Sciences (Bachelor)

# 2. Supporting student mobility

Financial Support for Student Mobility. Through its foundation, the UFG has implemented financial support mechanisms, including scholarships for academic and research mobility, aimed at supporting Georgian students wishing to study in France.

#### **Scholarships Awarded in 2024:**

- 2 PhD mobility grants (2-month research stays in France)
- 2 Scholarships for students of our program in viticulture and oenology (4-month internships in France)



# 2. Supporting student mobility through language courses

In cooperation with the AUF and the IFG, the FGU offers students the opportunity to take part in intensive French language training.

# FGU Project: French Language Contest to Promote French among Georgian Students

- A competition will be organized in the spring for Computer
   Science students who wish to improve their French.
- Participants will undergo an intensive training session, followed by a language test.
- The student with the highest score will win a three-week French course in Évry (France)



## 2. Developing scholarship programs

#### **New Partnership for 2025**

The FGU signed a cooperation agreement with the Rustaveli Foundation to launch a co-funded franco-Georgian scholarship program starting in 2025:

- 50% funded by the **Rustaveli Foundation**
- 50% funded by the FGU Foundation

Each year: 3 two-month research mobilities to France for Georgian PhD students



# 3. Developing scientific cooperation

- => Promotion of scientific cooperation between France and Georgia, with the organization of academic events (conferences, symposiums, and summer schools).
  - FGU's Annual Summer School, a tradition launched in 2023
    - Brings together Georgian, French, and international students and early-career researchers
    - Open to all disciplines: from humanities and social sciences to natural and exact sciences
    - Offers a unique opportunity to broaden knowledge and perspectives
    - Promotes dialogue between FR & GEO academic communities

Study Week in Geopolitics (September 2024)
 Co-organized with the French Institute of Geopolitics (Univ. of Paris 8)

Autumn School in Nuclear Physics (November 2024)

Co-organized with University of Paris-Saclay, Kutaisi International University, the French Embassy and the French Institute in Georgia

Launch of an Economics Lecture Series (November 2024)

First lecture held on November 26, 2024, with Dr. Christophe Cordonnier, followed by a discussion led by former Georgian Finance Minister Kakha Baindurashvili

#### **Key Activities in 2025**

#### **Economics Lecture Series (Ongoing)**

- In partnership with Caucasus University
- A platform connecting researchers, experts, policymakers, and business leaders from France and Georgia

# Co-organization Summer school "Armenia in Regional and Global Context" (May 2025 in Yerevan, Armenia)

- In partnership with Sciences-Po Paris
- · Co-organization of a study day focused on Georgia as part of this annual summer school

#### Summer School in Viticulture (October 2025 in Telavi)

- In partnership with Telavi University, Institut Agro Montpellier, and the private sector
- Participants: Bachelor's students from France and Georgia
- Focus on sustainable viticulture techniques and innovation in wine production

#### **Autumn School on Migration (November 2025 in Batumi)**

- Focus on Contemporary migration dynamics and border issues in the Caucasus
- Target audience: Master's and PhD students
- Continuation of the 2023 FGU migration school



# 4. Avancing training and technical support in the veterinary field

The FGU is actively pursuing initiatives in the field of **veterinary education**, a sector facing a shortage of qualified young professionals in Georgia.

#### **Key Actions in 2024–2025**

- Three specialized training sessions on bovine health were conducted with French experts, through funding from FranceAgriMer (Winter 2024).
- A Memorandum of Understanding was signed between Georgian Technical University (GTU) and the National Veterinary School of Toulouse (Summer 2024).
- A teaching visit by a professor from the National Veterinary School of Toulouse was held in Tbilisi (March 2025).



# 5. Strengthening FGU's Institutional Framework

- Launch of a new website (fgu.ge), improving visibility and communication with our partners, students, and the public
- Relocation of our office, back to the Ministry of Education, Science and Youth of Georgia
- Revision of FGU Foundation's statutes, ensuring the proper functioning of our activities
- Persistent budgetary unpredictability, posing ongoing challenges to long-term planning and operational stability
- Need for continued support from our supervising authorities
